

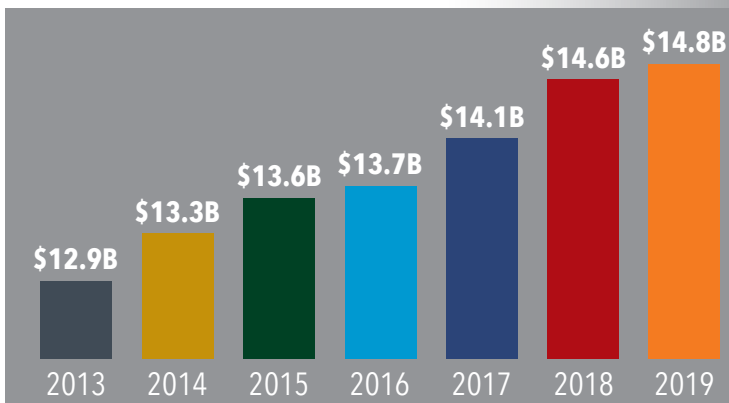
2018-19 STATE BUDGET

Respecting and protecting hard-working taxpayers

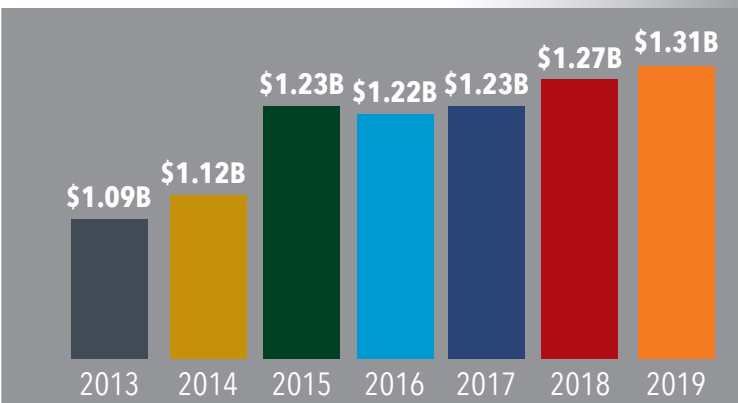
People deserve a budget that is efficient, effective and accountable.

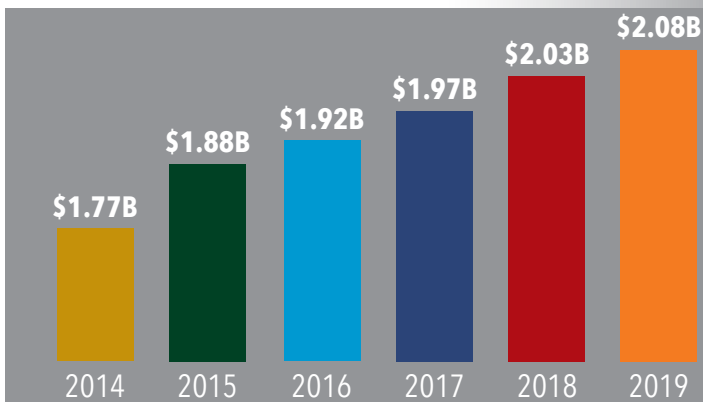

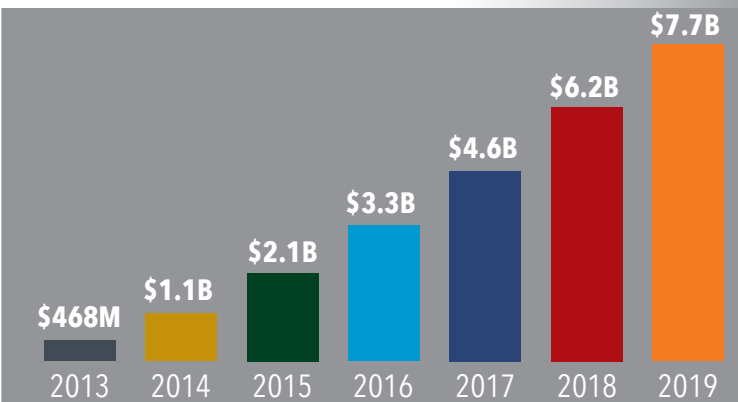
REVENUE SHARING TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS

Improving access to doctors in underserved areas, bolstering mental health services and devoting more resources to battle the opioid crisis will help more Michigan residents live happier, healthier lives.



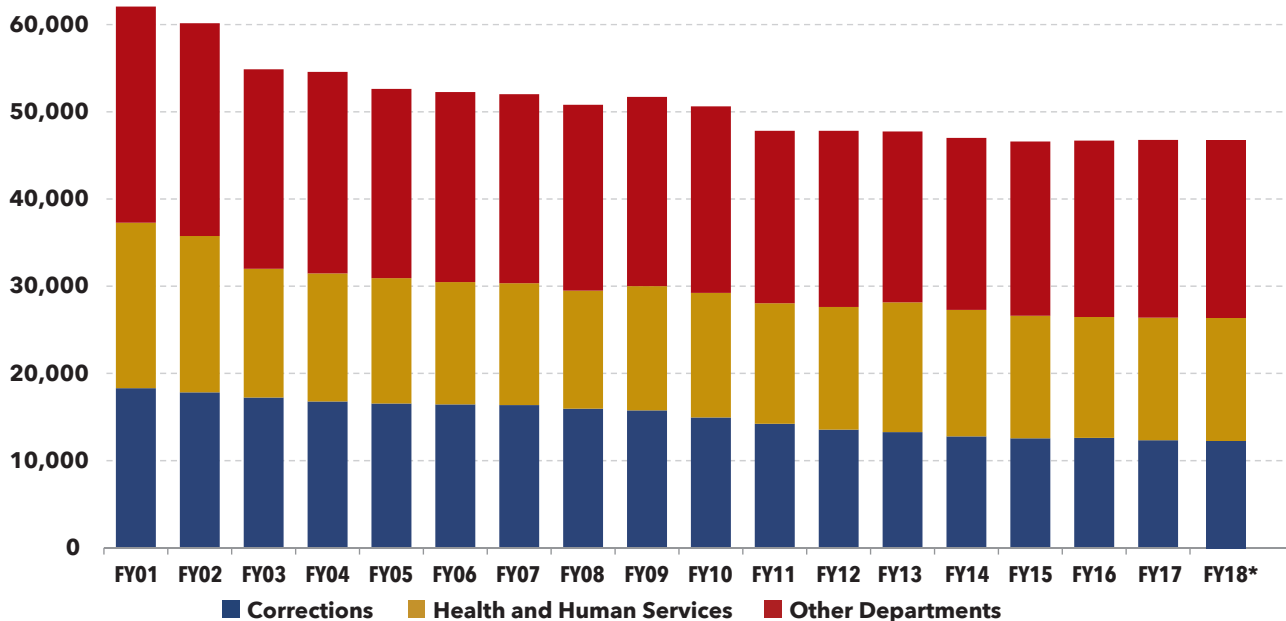
FIGHTING CRIME
